I could hardly speak to tell them what was going on, and I knew them both! But what I found was that by sharing it with them and knowing they would pray for me relieved some of the burden. I knew they would pray, and I didn't have to do it all. As Elvis sang:

Is your burden heavy as you bear it all alone? Does the road you travel harbor danger yet unknown? Are you growing weary in the struggle of it all? Jesus will help you when on His name you call. He is always there hearing every prayer faithful and true. Walking by our side in His love we hide all the day through. When you get discouraged just remember what to do. Reach out to Jesus, He's reaching out to you. Won't you please lighten your burden with us?


MISSION MATTERS

Two Notes from Our Mission Partners

A recent letter from Erin Minor, CEO of Harvest House:

"Our mission is all about transformation. We journey alongside people during some of the more pivotal moments in their lives. One young person's story in particular reminds me of the transformation that happens in a person's life in less than two years, and the implications on our collective future.

"DeeDee faced many adverse childhood experiences and by the age of 20 she found herself incarcerated. Upon completing her sentence, she was just 21 years old with nowhere to go.



program for young adults, DeeDee moved into our New Heights supportive housing program. With a team behind her, she was able to access mental health services, return to school and increase her income. She enrolled in the State College of Florida's nursing program and secured a job as a personal care attendant.

"A year and a half later, DeeDee is a straight A student, a budding artist and a stellar employee at her job. She has saved enough money to move into her own place when she completes the program. A donor recently heard of her accomplishments and doubled her savings!

"For the first time in her life, DeeDee has a space that she can call her own. She couldn't wait to decorate her room with string lights and canvases she painted at the Youth Drop-In Center. You can tell that she takes pride in her space and that it reflects the newfound peace in her life."



A recent letter from Allen Speer, CEO of Agape Flights:

"During a visit following the earthquake in Haiti, I had the opportunity to spend a night in Les Cayes, Haiti, with Jim and April Starkey. One of Jim and April's three sons is named Zeke. Zeke had given up his room to me as the guest in their home – a great sacrifice.

"On the morning of my departure, I was packing my belongings when Zeke walked into his room. I could tell he wanted to talk, and once again in his own way he told me that he was glad that I had visited his family. He then proceeded to ask if he could pray for me. Placing his small hand on my shoulder, my friend Zeke prayed a precious prayer asking God to watch after me in my travels throughout the region.

"Touched and moved by the care and concern of this little boy, God reminded me that not only do we serve adult mission partners and others in need through Agape Flights, we serve their children as well."






January: Imagine Heaven by John Burke





Imagine Heaven is an inspirational journey through the Bible's picture of heaven, colored in with the real-life stories of heaven's wonders. 
February: Where the Light Fell by Philip Yancey
