

#### **The Pastor's Page**

#### More Than 'Back to Normal'

A Happy New Year to all our members and friends! I hope and pray that 2023 will see us flourish as a congregation, enjoy the opportunities God sets before us and grow in our faith, our trust, our mission and service!

In one of the congregations I previously served, an interesting situation developed when two key members of staff announced within a day of one another that they were resigning their positions. Both had excellent reasons behind their departures, and neither knew of the other's intentions, so the timing was pure coincidence. That didn't stop the rumor machine from kicking into top gear, although this was many years before fake news became a thing. Many people assumed that their departure signaled serious trouble within the staff and convincing them otherwise proved difficult.

"What's happening at the church?" people asked, and soon the rumors took flight. Happily, sanity soon took over and I remember my gratitude when a highly respected member of the congregation said in a meeting, "What's happening at the church? I'll tell you what's happening at the church: life's happening!" He spoke about how often life brings changes and challenges. His comments allowed the staff members' reasons for resigning to be heard and eventually understood and accepted. The rumors soon subsided.

I found myself recalling that incident last year and, with it, John Lennon's famous remark that life is what happens when you've made other plans, as I began to think of 2022 as 'the year of the three secretaries.'! Kathy Butler retired after years of outstanding service, Susan Scott joined us with an impressive resume and plans to settle in Sarasota, then her life circumstances changed and she felt forced to resign. We were happy to find her replacement when Nancy Prezbindowski joined the staff. Incidentally, Kathy Butler could not have been more helpful in coming back to the office and helping both of her successors with orientation and settling in!

That should have been sufficient upheaval for one year, but as 2022 drew to a close, it acquired an additional moniker, 'the year of the three organists'!! Jeremy Silverman had resigned early in the summer and after a careful search we appointed Bryan Cordell as accompanist and organist. Unfortunately, Hurricane lan raged through Florida in the fall, and did considerable

damage to Bryan's home. Bryan has found the hassles of finding tradesmen, organizing schedules and overseeing all the necessary work amounted to more than the equivalent of a full time job and Bryan felt he needed to resign, which we accepted with regret. Christmas Day was his last service with us.

A search for Brian's replacement began and several candidates who had not been available earlier in the year now offered for consideration, and the search committee soon settled on Chris Westfall, a musician not entirely unknown to us. In addition to his extensive experience in other churches. Chris had featured on two previous occasions as a recitalist in our concert series, and has actually accompanied choir practice on an earlier occasion too! So there was considerable satisfaction in the committee when he accepted the position and Session confirmed the appointment at our December meeting. Chris will begin with us at the end of January. Here too, we have been fortunate that Chris's predecessors, Kathleen Semisch and Susan Crumpler have been very helpful in various ways, for which we are very grateful.

Members will understand that a considerable amount of work lay behind all of these searches: finding candidates, checking references, holding interviews by phone and in person Leading to the selection of a successful candidate. Bob Elwell, Chair of Session's Personnel Committee, has accordingly had a busier year than, I suspect, all of his predecessors combined! His has been a wonderful piece of service! For the music search he was joined by Diana Neely, Chair of the Worship Committee, and Lutie Uihlein, (and our thanks to both!) with the Director of Music and the Pastor as non-voting consultants.

No doubt we will find times in 2023 when we go through experiences with life and other plans, but if we bring to those challenges the faith and commitment we have seen in 2022, and trust in God's unchanging faithfulness, we will find blessing and purpose. Certainly God has been unfailingly good in leading us thus far as a congregation, and I am confident of his grace and goodness for this new year. We have so much to be grateful for and so much to rejoice in together!

#### **Christ Church Helps Selah Freedom Expand Reach**

Thanks to the generosity of Christ Church members and friends, and an increase in mission funding in 2022 from the retirement of church bonds, our church was able to fully match a \$50,000 challenge grant by the Patterson Foundation to help Selah Freedom start an important new initiative.

Selah Freedom – which serves survivors of sex trafficking in our area – is expanding a new program to help start trafficking survivor programs throughout the country. This year alone, Selah has received 60 phone calls from around the country and Canada on how best to set up a program in their region. Selah will now have a dedicated staff designed to help other cities establish a successful survivor program.

The new initiative will offer both digital training course curricula as well as actual hands-on assistance to develop a residential program that is safe, sustainable and successful. Such programs offer trauma therapy, counseling services, a safe place to live, life skills, and assistance on educational and employment goals. Selah Freedom is acknowledged throughout the country as a successful model for dealing with trafficking survivors. 87% of program graduates never return to the streets.

This new endeavor of Selah Freedom can be a game-changer in terms of the constant battle against sex trafficking and the abuse of young girls throughout the country.

In acknowledging the \$50,000 grant, Executive Director Stacey Efaw said "Donors like Christ Church are the lifeblood of Selah Freedom, and Selah Freedom is the lifeline to survivors of sex trafficking. Thank you so much!"
