

H. Jack Hunkele Charter Member of Christ Church

A couple of weeks ago I read an article in Sarasota's Sunday paper about Aryana, a young girl who had overcome traumatic past as a young child and had gone on to win a Strive Award for overcoming her challenges, and as a high school senior was being recognized for her scholastic achievement.

Of note, the Strive Awards were conceived of and are funded by H. Jack Hunkele, a charter member of Christ Church. It was Jack's vision to recognize students who have overcome tremendous challenges to succeed in life.

Jack also had a vision for Christ Church. He served on the church's long range planning committee that had the courage to step out in faith to construct our present church facilities and was a generous supporter in both the acquisition of the property and the construction of the Church building itself.

What you may not know is that the Reading Buddies are a result of Jack's initiative. He got the idea from his daughter who was engaged in a similar program in California.

Jack started by forming a small committee of John Dixon, Bob Dods, Bill Buckley, Sally Rauch and myself. We hired a teacher and rented an apartment close to the school to use as a classroom. We struggled to succeed for a couple of years until the professionals arrived in the persons of Beverly Sutton and Karen Fors.

The association with the Dream Center in Bradenton was just that, a dream, and we were on our way.

God put Christ Church here for a purpose. He sent remarkable people like Jack Hunkele our way, so we could make his remarkable dream a reality.

On April 3, the Dream Center children and their families enjoyed a day of celebrating our children's achievements in reading. The children in the Reading Buddies Program were recognized for excellence in attendance, citizenship, effort and progress. Six children received the three-year award (a bicycle, a helmet and a lock) for demonstrating excellence for three years in the program. Fourteen years ago, when we held our first Awards Assembly, only seven parents attended the event. This year we set up for 180 guests, and almost every seat was filled. Reading is contagious! Highlighted Collections for May

In the Faith and Spiritual Growth Collection, 200 General includes unique topics: a bit of humor, three books by scientists who provide evidence of God through their studies, and An Uncommon Guide to Retirement which is about finding God's purpose for your next stage of life. If you are looking for a particular faith based book or author, the grey notebook on the wall lists books in this collection by author, title and category.

In addition to the **Biographies** currently on display on our regular shelves, we highlight some favorites from the past. Examine Jon Meacham's writings about Andrew Jackson, Thomas Jefferson or George W. Bush or Ron Chernow's descriptions of Alexander Hamilton and John D. Rockefeller. The widely read *Shoe Dog* by Phil Knight chronicles the rise of Nike from a few boxes of shoes to an international name brand.

Our highlighted author, **Geraldine Brooks**, began her career as a recognized international journalist and moved into writing award winning novels that are thoroughly researched and beloved by many. Each of her six novels have different settings and characters. Her first novel, *Year of Wonders*, was an international bestseller about the plague while *March* is a Pulitzer Prize winner and *The Secret Chord* is about the life of King David.

For 29 years, Turning Points has been helping Manatee County's most vulnerable keep their homes, stay healthy, navigate services and find work.

Just in this past year -

8.309 men, women and children received critical assistance

1,440 patients received medical and dental care

555 children remained in stable housing with their families

316 veterans received services

There are countless stories of families, veterans, the elderly, and individuals who have benefitted from Turning Points services.

Like Steven, who lost his job and housing during COVID, and he and his girlfriend and two young girls were living in his car. The case managers assisted him in getting into housing. He started volunteering at Turning Points, then he was hired as the Personal Services Coordinator. And just recently, he was promoted to Day Resources Manager at Turning Points. He is now part of the Leadership Team.

Like Dana, who lost everything after her stroke and was living in her SUV. Her health was declining, and so was her hope; then, she came to Turning Points. The Turning Points team helped Dana secure a disability voucher. Today Dana and her daughter are living in a lovely duplex, she's going to physical therapy and focusing on her health. Her daughter is starting college in the fall to become a physical therapist.

Like Bobby, an 85-year-old veteran who was sleeping on the streets in his motorized wheelchair for two years. He couldn't seem to get the help he needed - until he met the Turning Points navigators. Today, Bobby is comfortably living in an assisted living home with a soft bed and three hot meals a day.

The Turning Points staff is assisted by volunteers, including some from CCLBK. Our area is truly blessed to have such a caring, efficient organization devoted to helping the most vulnerable in their time of need.
