The Prayer Shawl Ministry of Christ Church of LBK begins with knitters, who lovingly create shawls and smaller items. They are created with a stitch pattern—Knit 3, Purl 3—which symbolizes our triune God: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Periodically (like today), finished items are presented to be formally blessed in worship, commissioned for their purpose to be a reminder of the presence and comfort of our Lord, as well as a reminder of the prayerful, loving support of our community. They are presented to individuals experiencing illness, injury, grief, or other need. The Deacons oversee distribution (see insert back page).
